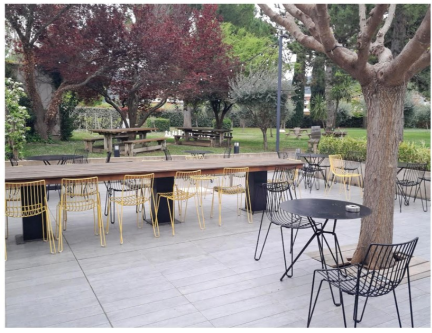
AAGP FAMILY BUFFET & BARBECUE

WUTHERING HEIGHTS is a 1939 American romantic period drama directed by William Wyler, produced by Samuel Goldwyn & starring Merle Oberon, Laurence Olivier & David Niven.

It is based on the 1847 Novel Wuthering Heights by Emily Brontë. Though reviews at the time were polarized, Wuthering Heights has come to be considered one of the greatest novels written in English. For some it was the interminable story of two terrible people determined to destroy

everything around them, for others, the novel is one of the greatest love stories of all times.

As a boy, Heathcliff is brought home from the streets of Liverpool by Cathy's father to live with her & her brother. At first reluctant, because of their class difference, Cathy eventually accepts Heathcliff & later falls in love with him but realizes that their childish love is impossible, especially after her father's death & her brother's desolate behavior. Heathcliff goes off to seek his fortune & returns to find her married into High Society- a discovery that shatters his soul but cannot touch the burning desire that will rage in him forever.



The most famous line from Wuthering Heights is "Whatever our souls are made of, his & mine are the same"

The N.Y. Times review of the 2026 adaptation, recently in cinemas here, calls it not worthy of the title Wuthering Heights.

The path leads through the forest of the "Fontaine de Voire" and then upwards towards the "Col de la Selle" where there is a commanding view over the city of Marseille on one side and the calanques on the other side. We will then continue up another path to reach the "Plateau de l'Homme Mort" (altitude 350 metres approx.) before taking an unmarked path to the "Belvédère de Titou & Ninou". This is a narrow ledge near the top of a cliff overlooking the sea and the islands off the coast, and where we can stop for our picnic lunch.



Taking into account that this hike coincides with the "fête de la musique", I hold the view that it would be better to return to the cars no later than by mid afternoon. We will therefore return to the cars via a steeper but quicker path. I wish to add that there are no particular difficulties along the way, so children used to hiking and dogs on a leash are welcome.

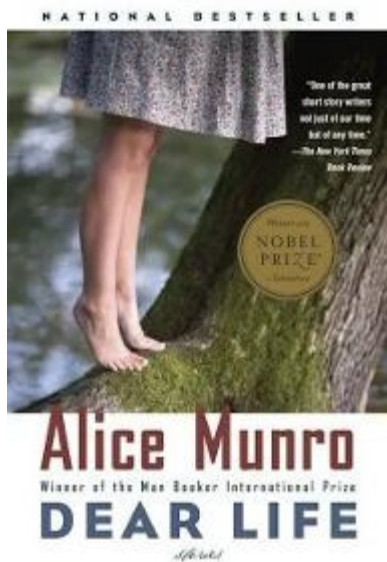

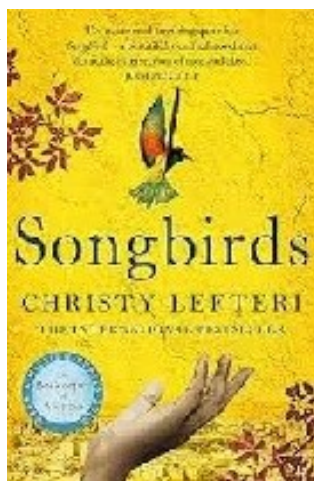
BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

true events, the story follows the disappearance of Nisha, a Sri Lankan nanny, highlighting themes of race, class, and the invisibility of foreign workers, while echoing the tragic, real-life murders of migrant women on the island. Reviewers consistently mention the book's emotional weight, highlighting the difficult, often invisible, lives of migrant women who work as domestic help in Cyprus.

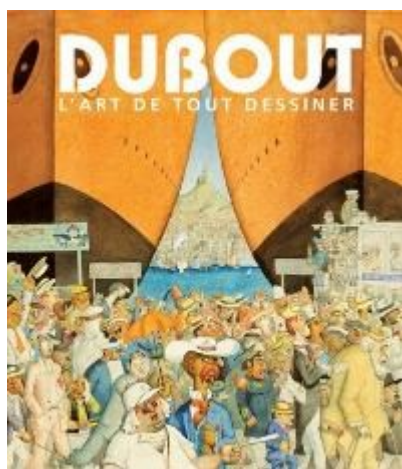
