To honor the 80th anniversary of the Normandy landing (June 6, 1944) we have chosen the WWII thriller *The Train*.

*The Train* is a 1964 war film directed by John Frankenheimer and starring Burt Lancaster, Paul Scofield, and Jeanne Moreau and Michel Simon for French authenticity.

The film takes place in Paris, August 1944. With the Allied army closing in, German commander and art fanatic Colonel Von Waldheim (Paul Scofield) is attempting to move a vast collection of art stolen from the Louvre and the Jeu de Paume and load it on a train bound for Berlin. Curator Mademoiselle Villard goes to see resistance leader Labich (Burt Lancaster) to enlist his aid. As the Allies are very close to Paris, they have only to delay the train for a few days. Labich vows to stop the train at any cost. Calling on his vast arsenal of skills, he unleashes a torrent of devastation and destruction - loosened rails, shattered tracks and head-on collisions - in an impassioned, suspense-filled quest for justice, retribution and revenge.

Inspired by an actual event and highlighted by spectacular stunt work and visual effects, *The Train* is a superior, edge-of-your-seat, thrilling and suspenseful film. John Frankenheimer does not disappoint.

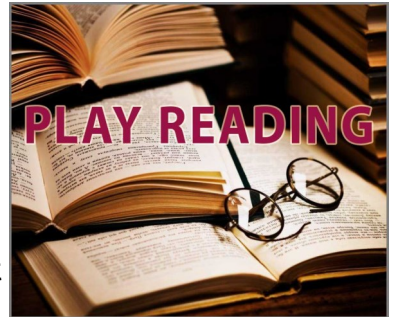

## **BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP**

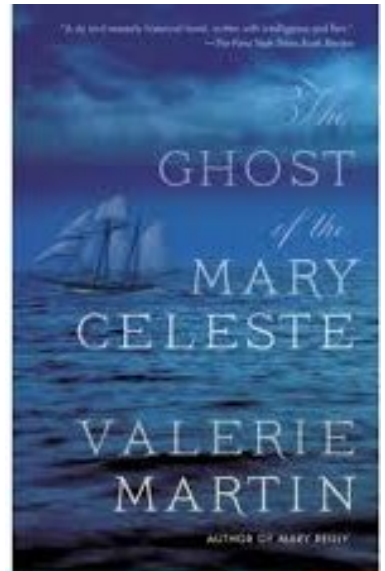

*The Ghost of the Mary Celeste* by Valerie Martin, presented by Susan Stone

What is myth and what is the historic record ?

On 4<sup>th</sup> December 1872, a merchant brigantine called the *Mary Celeste*, out of New York and headed for Genoa, was found drifting in the Atlantic off Portugal, under full sail but apparently abandoned. Of the ten people who were aboard, seven crewmen and master Benjamin Briggs, his wife and their two-year-old daughter, there was no sign, although all the possessions of those on board seemed to be in place, along with enough food and fresh water for six months; her cargo was intact. This maritime mystery lies at the center of an intricate narrative branching through the highest levels of late 19<sup>th</sup> century literary society. Various theories attributed her fate to undersea earthquakes, sea monsters, methanol fumes and insurance fraud, but most of all she attracted storytellers. A fledgling writer, Arthur Conan Doyle was instrumental in fixing the mystery in the public imagination; he published a fictionalized account in an 1884 magazine.

The author, Valerie Martin, looks behind the myth and brings an extraordinary story to life as an examination of love, nature and the



fictions that pass as truth. Despite the nod to the supernatural in her title, Martin swerves a century of speculation and melodrama in favor of immersing herself in the real lives of those involved, and conjuring up their long-lost world.

The fate of the *Mary Celeste* drew the attention of researchers at the Smithsonian Institution, and a program, "The True Story of the 'Mary Celeste'" premiered on November 4<sup>th</sup>, 2007, on its DirecTV channel. Readers will have to wait until the meeting to discover the truth.
